



From the Pastor's Study

MISPLACED CHARITY

The other day, I was going through the drive-thru at Starbucks. As I approached the window a young barista looked at me with a smile and told me that the lady in the car in front of me had already paid for me. I wish I could report that I was thrilled, grateful, and pleasantly surprised. Instead, I was rather annoyed and frustrated.

This has happens to me often and every time it occurs, I don't like it. Truth be told, I have broken the chain of *paying for the car behind you* numerous times. One time, I was the 22nd person to be a part of it. I chose not to continue it. In fact, I stop it every time. I'm sure you are wondering why I'm such a Scrooge about this. Let me explain.

Talking to baristas and people who work at establishments like Starbucks, I learned that most people don't tip the workers. Yet, it is the workers who need our charity the most. They are the working poor that we hear about but rarely think of. They are trying to get through schools and "life" so they work hard at these locations.

Research has shown that the people who frequent Starbucks and coffee shops tend to not need charity and in fact, should be charitable. Thus, when I find I am a part of the charitable chain reaction at a drive-thru, I choose not to pay for the person behind me but instead tip the barista what I would have paid for the drink. They are the ones that need the charity the most.

I find that so much of charity today goes to organizations or people that (in my estimation) don't need it nor deserve it. The NRA should offend you (not because of politics of guns, that's an entire other article) because their executives have abused the members' trust and grifted millions for their own personal lifestyles. The political parties and their ancillary organizations continue to shape events in Washington and Albany that fit their agendas instead of being purveyors of truth and services. Colleges have spent so much money on gyms and dorms while paying professors and important people of their campuses measly amounts. There are much more but I will stop here.

ELCA News

Presiding Bishop issues pastoral message on Fulton v. City of Philadelphia: As children of God, we give thanks for all of the LGBTQIA+ people who experience God's calling to the holy work of parenting. In particular response to the June 17 Supreme Court ruling on <u>Fulton v. City of Philadelphia</u>, the ELCA stands with our LGBTQIA+ siblings in Christ and reaffirms our commitment to equal protection, opportunities, and responsibilities under the law (*Human Sexuality: Gift and Trust*, p. 33).

Children and youth in the child welfare system are among the most vulnerable members of our society, and a disproportionate number of young people in the child welfare system are LGBTQIA+ and in need of compassionate and supportive homes. Our concern as disciples of Christ is for their best interests. This includes recognizing and affirming the vocation of LGBTQIA+ people as parents and foster parents.

Each of us can respond through ongoing education and action in support of LGBTQIA+ people, including those who are called to provide loving care for children, and through compassionate care for our most vulnerable children and youth.
