## From the Pastor's Desk

February is, of course, the shortest month and even with an extra day this year, it is going to feel jam-packed with things to do, and ideas to digest. In the church this is especially true as Lent begins pretty early this year.



Ash Wednesday falls on February 14<sup>th</sup>, which is, as you know, when we observe St. Valentine's Day. Thinking ahead to that day, I've been trying to reconcile what I will say to people as they come forward to receive ashes. At the same time as we are celebrating romantic love, I will also be reminding people of their mortality!

It feels like these two ideas should not go together. On the surface, the phrases, "Will you be my Valentine?" and "Remember you are dust, and to dust you shall return" seem about as far apart as we can get. Yet, I think there is a link when we put these ideas in the context of Jesus Christ's life, ministry, death, and resurrection.

In Lent, as we follow Jesus to the cross, we think about the ways that we have fallen short, and the about God's call to return to him. One of the readings often used for Ash Wednesday is from the second chapter of Joel. The prophet Joel warns of the day of the Lord which is about to happen, a day of darkness, gloom, clouds, and terrible war. Joel is writing after the people of Israel have been afflicted by a terrible plague of locusts. Their food supply has been taken from them and everything seems to be bad news. The people of Israel and Judah are facing their own mortality in this moment. And in this moment Joel reminds them:

Yet even now, says the LORD, return to me with all your heart,
with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning; rend your hearts and not your clothing.
Return to the LORD, your God, for he is gracious and merciful,
slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love, and relents from punishing.

This is our call today. In the face of tragedy, pain and sadness; in the middle of grief and death and loss, God still calls to us, reminding us that the love that is given is steadfast. That love was made real in the person of Jesus, who carried the cross, carried our pain and sadness and loss, and in his great love, allowed himself and all our fear to be crucified.

We know that our time on this earth is temporary. We also know and trust and hope in love that never ends, and that death is not the end of the story.

"Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return, and God loves you more than you can understand."

## Altar Guild Notes: February, 2024

February is a short month with a lot to do! Gonna be busy. Let's see what's ahead!

The first Sunday is the last Sunday in our current season, Time after Epiphany.


The sanctuary is still draped in green. The altar frontal image of the shepherd and the lambs has held our focus, Christ as our Good Shepherd & Christ as our sacrificial lamb. Christ with us, Christ for us, Christ in us.

The second Sunday we celebrate Transfiguration of our Lord. Jesus is on a mountaintop with 3 disciples. There, the disciples see Jesus transfigured in a vision of spectacular dazzling brightness. The divinity of Jesus is so blinding they cannot see His face. Notice the altar frontal on the white parament.



See the radiant beams around Jesus head. We cannot see His face either.

It is Wednesday, Ash Wednesday. We are in church. No white, no green.



The last two Sundays continue our Lenten journey. The purple paraments tell the story of what's to come. The shine of the brass vases are covered in purple. There are no flowers, but the bare branches inside have buds of life to come.

There will be much introspection, perhaps some personal austerity during this season. The sanctuary candle burns continuously. The altar candles are ignited when we gather in church for the Word and the Eucharist. There is always light. Christ is with us now, too.

"Christ be our light. Shine in our hearts. Shine in the darkness."

May this light shine so brightly that all may see Christ in our lives & theirs.

## A Message From the Co-Presidents

Welcome to 2024. We had a difficult start with the passing of Jim, Phil, and Judy, and our hearts go out to their families and friends who are in mourning. They will be truly missed, but they are in a better place now.

We would like to thank Mark Steck who has finished his 2nd 3-year term on council. Thanks for all the time, effort, and expertise you put in. Welcome Duane.

Our congregational meeting was held on January 28th and our finances were reviewed and presented by Justin from Bonadio. We received the highest rating. Pastor gave his annual address as did Shari and Paul.

We would like to thank all the committees for all the work they've done in 2023, and we look forward to a wonderful 2024.

Property update: We are looking to replace the rug in the sanctuary and we received an anonymous donation to cover a substantial portion of the costs. Depending on the color we may need to replace the fabric on the kneelers as well. A committee is being put together. We have also received a partial grant to cover a security camera and intercom system at the church door. This would complement the security in the child care as the church door is not monitored. If access is via the church door, it would allow access to the child care center for anybody entering. The parking lot will also need to be redone which is a large and expensive job. We need to raise some funds for these Capital improvements and are discussing a potential barbecue fundraiser in the fall to help offset some of the costs. The projected capital campaign fund raising is \$15,000 for interior projects, and the goal amount for the parking lot is \$30,000-\$35,000.

#### Outreach

I have created the 2024 Ride for Roswell St. Timothy's Lutheran Church and Child Care Center team. Please consider joining or supporting our riders to help fund cancer research. This team last year consisted of church members and their families and friends, so please invite other riders to join this great cause and make our 2nd year even better than last year. The Ride for Roswell has many routes both short and long and will be on June 22nd this year. There are also fun social get togethers where you pay for a beer at one of the hosting restaurants and the money goes towards your ride donation.

Mark Steck is spearheading here at St Timothy a chili cook-off community event on March 9th. We are looking for volunteers to make chili and help in other ways. Of course we need you to sample and vote for your favorite chili, too!

## News and upcoming Events

#### **Congregational Meeting Highlights**

Thank you to everyone who attended and presented at our congregational meeting! After some good time in fellowship around delicious food, Justin from Bonadio gave us a report on our audit, which received an unmodified rating—the highest possible. A unanimous ballot vote for Council representative resulted in Duane Keeler accepting his first term, Karen Sturniolo accepting her first full term after completing a partial term, and Dorine Fabio accepting her second and final full term.

Some of the larger property items we dealt with this last year, along with upcoming planned projects, were reviewed. Of note, our parking lot is in poor shape. A full redo is preferable— somewhere between \$30,000 and \$35,000—however, if funds do not allow, another short-term-fix patch job can be done for maybe around \$15,000. In order to help us pay for this, it was suggested we approach the congregation with the option to "buy" a square foot or parking-space-worth of parking lot to make the job more manageable. Please look for upcoming correspondence in regards to this later in the month. A BBQ fundraiser in the fall will likely be held as well.

A presentation by Tracy Marrs, our Assistant Director of the Child Care Center, informed us that things are going well with our ministry. Enrollment is high, and the kids and families love coming. The current struggle, which Justin earlier reiterated all care industries are struggling with, is finding and retaining staff. Further presentations by Paul, Shari, and Pastor Adam gave us a thorough overview of the year and passed along thanks and appreciation for everyone who makes this community run smoothly. They also noted with gratitude the support we have for each other.

New business brought up another item of note: a generous, anonymous donation was made and was suggested to be put towards a new carpet in the sanctuary. A request was made to raise additional funds to cover the remainder of the carpet expense along with various smaller interior improvement projects. We are \$8,000 towards our \$15,000 goal, and additional designated contributions are welcome using the fabric square board in the Narthex (note: fear not—these are not carpet color options!). If you would be interested in being among those who will meet to decide on the rug, please let the office know so we can coordinate a meeting.

Finally, our first annual chili cook-off received an enthusiastic response. We're excited to host this fun fellowship event on Saturday, March 9th, and we hope you're able to join us! Please see below for further details.
