From the Pastor's Desk

Now there are varieties of gifts but the same Spirit, and there are varieties of services but the same Lord, and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. ⁷ To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good.

~ 1 Corinthians 12:4-7

On a Saturday this past month, our church council took a retreat to Stella Niagara for the day. We had a good conversation about where St. Tim's has been, who we are today, and our hopes for the future. As part of our discussion, we recognized the ways that St. Timothy Lutheran Church of Grand Island is a place where people use their gifts. Each person who is a part of this community brings with them experience, talent, gifts, and a spirit of collaboration that keeps St. Timothy thriving. Each of you contribute in ways that match your interest and gifts. It continues to amaze me how God is at work at St. Tim's through your gifts and the work that your hands and hearts produce.

Though all these gifts are different, they all work together through the Spirit to do the work of the church together.

If I might be so bold, it seems to me that Paul's list was incomplete. The Spirit continues to give and manifest gifts within each of us that work for the common good for the church today! The gift of teaching Sunday School, the gifts of assisting in worship, the gifts of preparing the sanctuary and altar for worship, the gift of giving of our time and treasure in order to maintain a safe and appealing building in which to gather, the gift of gardening and tending to plants, the gift of holding children and reading them stories, the gift of music and sharing it together, the gift of welcoming hugs, the gift of understanding building codes and how asphalt works, the gift of graphic design, and of doing small and big repairs. Altar Guild Notes: September, 2025

The more things change the more they stay the same. The long green season of Time after Pentecost continues. But, feel the change in the air? It's a little cooler. Feel the hustle bustle of life is creeping back in our lives? It's happening at church too!

Did you notice the paraments are different? Still green for the season! This green set is the oldest handmade set made here at St. Timothy. Skilled women used appliqué and embroidery along with sewing techniques to create them.

Single 9:30 service returns this month. We will all be together again. Rally day will stir us with installation of teachers, Harvest House donations will be recognized and picked up. But wait, still more this day! This year, the centuries old festival, Holy Cross Day, falls on this Sunday!

A festival calls for red! However, the red paraments will stay tucked away until Reformation Sunday. But you will see accents of red.

Why not the red paraments, you ask.....
Well..... The scheduled lectionary reading
for this day is a much loved, familiar passage
from Luke referring to Jesus as our
shepherd. Now look at that center green
frontal. There is Jesus with his shepherd's
crook in front of the cross. He has turned a
cross of suffering and death into a divine
use, to find and save His sheep. An image to
see and carry in our hearts today.

The cross is a major image in our faith, representing who we are and whose we are. The empty cross reminds us that Christ not only died on the cross for us but rose again, human and divine! King and Savior.





Look around the sanctuary to see how many ways and places you see a cross. The windows, the fabrics, the candles. It is carved, molded, sewn, engraved, painted in so many ways to inspire us.

The weather is getting cooler and kids are heading back to school, we are all getting busy for the fall. We have a very busy end of the year coming.

The Chiavetta's BBQ is right around the corner on September 18th. We are looking for a lot of volunteers to help to make this a success. The money raised will be put towards the extra expense of the parking lot. Before that we have the fall clean-up day on the 6th from 9:00 to 11:00 to spruce up the property before the BBQ, Trunk-or-Treat at the end of October, and Breakfast with Santa in mid-December where we have a large number of non-members coming to our church and child care center. These are opportunities to introduce our warm and welcoming community, facilities, and services to the greater community.

For outreach we've been collecting for Harvest House and it looks like another banner year based on the contents in the coat room. We will be collecting school supplies for the child care center towards the end of September, and we have the BBQ coming up shortly. St Timothy's Lutheran Church and Child Care Team raised \$1520 for Ride for Roswell cancer research. Church members painted some hand-carved ornaments to sell at the Erie County Fair for the Make-a-Wish Foundation. The total raised for Make-A-Wish was \$59,600 from the turners and woodcarvers.

A Boy Scout troop will be using our fellowship hall again this school year, and the Grand Island Community Chorus will be holding rehearsals in the sanctuary on Sunday evenings starting this month.

On a sad note, Guhan will be leaving us and taking a job in New York City where he found sponsorship for his Visa. His last day is August 31st. Our search has started for a new organist. We we'll miss him but we wish him well in his new endeavors.

Our work continues updating the property. We have new lighting in the back by the playground and child care office after removing the old light poles, which posed a potential risk with rusted-through bases. We also have new flooring in the preschool classroom to replace the carpet in what was once the old child care office. All the child care rooms have been repainted and look great.

On September 28th, will have our congregational meeting to go over our 25-26 year budget as our fiscal year comes to an end. Join us for a potluck brunch and some fellowship after the service that morning before the meeting begins.

Thank you to everybody who continues to support our Church and Child Care Center through your donations and your time and effort on many of our committees. As Shari always says, we have a small but mighty family here at St Timothy's Lutheran Church and Child Care Center.
